TUJENGE AFRICA FOUNDATION RECEIVES \$100,000 DONATION FROM PHILANTHROPIST STEPHEN PEEL

NEW HAVEN, CT – Tujenge Africa Foundation has been awarded a \$100,000 donation from philanthropist and investor Stephen Peel.

The grant to Tujenge Africa Foundation will be used to operate its flagship Tujenge Scholars Program. Currently in its first year of operation, the program will welcome its second cohort of students in January for an intensive leadership, scholarship and peace-building gap-year. Upon completion of the 15-month-long program, scholars will matriculate at elite universities around the world, where they will continue to hone skills and make connections that will prepare them to be the next generation of ethical leaders in their country.

Burundi's needs are astronomical, but the resources are few, often non-existent. I'm thrilled to see the robust and non-linear approach that the Tujenge Africa Foundation has taken to support Burundi's post-war nation-building. The potential for transformation is real.
